State Representative Ann Vermillion

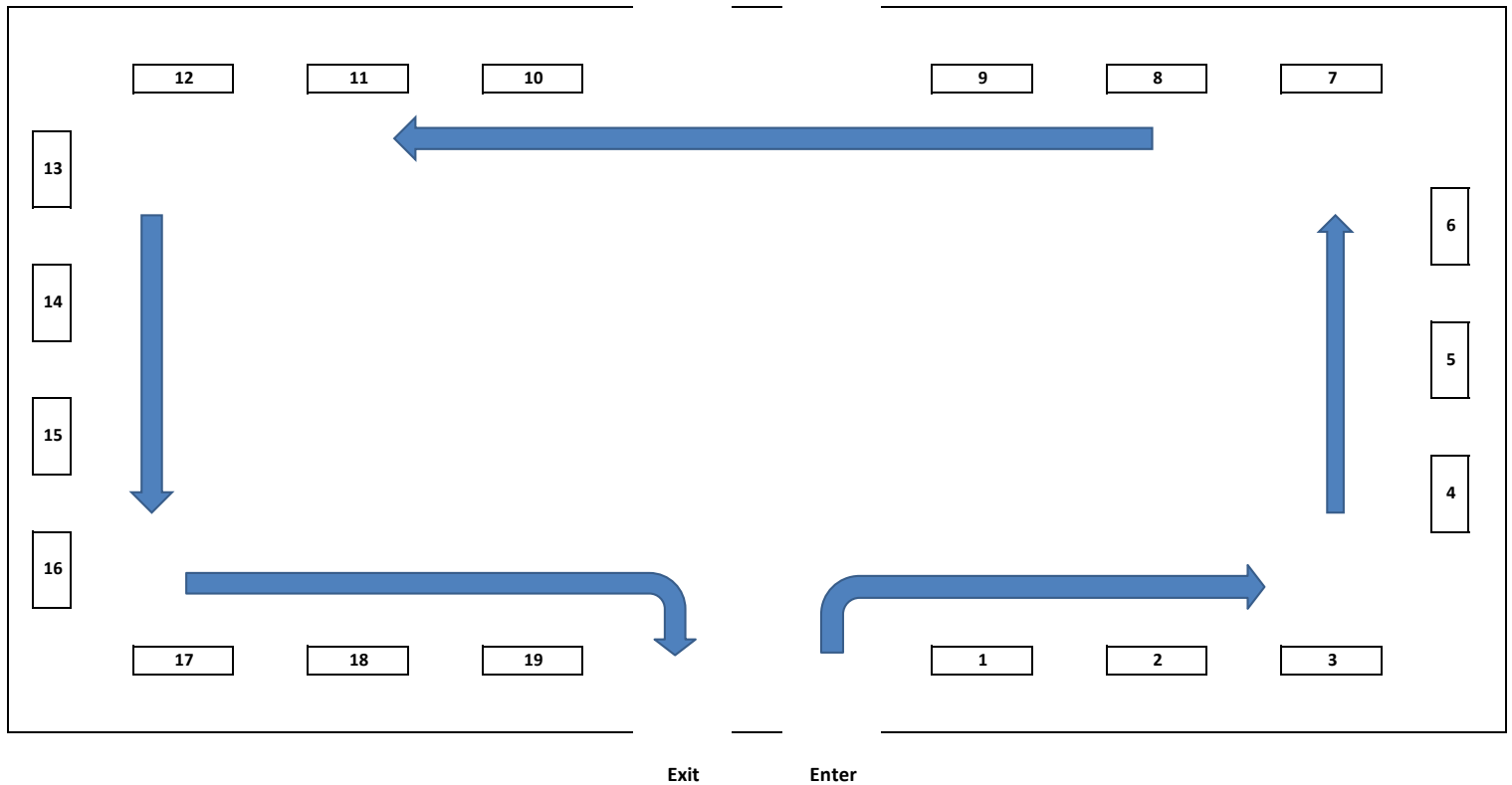
